Parents' evening next week



Covid Rules

It has been a great relief to many to see the rules around Covid gradually relaxing, as we have been allowed to see friends and go shopping since Monday 12th April. Please remember, though, that the rules for school and self-isolation have not changed. If your child, or anyone else in your household, experiences any of the three main symptoms of persistent cough, temperature of 37.8 degrees celsius or higher, or loss of taste or smell you should begin self-isolation and book a Covid test. Our classes remain in separate bubble groups, and bubble closures are still a possibility if infection finds its way into the school. Thank you for your co-operation.

Governor quote

I hope you all enjoyed the Easter break and welcome back to school. Although the weather was very changeable, I did manage to see many of you out and about in the village over holiday period. Some of you came to the activities we held in St Mary's churchyard. Despite it being a very cold Good Friday morning, the children arrived and in the space of a couple of hours, using sand, moss, pebbles and jars crammed full of flowers, created a beautiful Easter garden by the South Porch. The Christmas tree that had been put up in church to celebrate the birth of Jesus had now been turned into a cross to remind us of his death. As well as creating the Easter garden, the children made crosses to decorate the porch. We listened to the story of Good Friday and how it was in the Garden of Gethsemane that Jesus went to pray after the Last Supper and where he was betrayed by Judas and arrested. We reminded ourselves that this was just Part One of the Easter story and when we came back on Sunday we would hear that there was a happy ending!

The weather was slightly warmer on the Sunday morning and we listened to the second part of the story and saw that the stone in front of the tomb had been rolled away and the tomb was empty. We added daffodils to the cross to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. The children then had great fun hunting for Easter eggs in the churchyard. Some of the congregation even got offered one as they came out of the church service!

'Going on a Bear Hunt' also proved to be a popular activity for many families in and around the village. Fourteen knitted bears had been hidden in the Cricket field and the surrounding woods. This was certainly something that all members of the family could enjoy and thanks to 'Nanny Dawn' for organising it.

We are now looking forward to an exciting and busy Summer Term.
