COVID 19 RETURN-TO-SCHOOL ARRANGEMENTS KEY POINTS:

- The first day of school is <u>Tuesday 2nd June</u>.
- The **only** pupils returning to school are: **Nursery**, **Reception**, **Year 1**, **Year 6** and vulnerable pupils who have been attending school during the previous half-term.
- Children in other year groups will continue to be offered provision at home via the Seesaw online learning platform.
- Until further notice, school will be opening only on **Mondays**, **Tuesdays** and **Wednesdays**.
- Your child should wear school uniform if possible. If this is not possible (for example, if your child has outgrown their uniform and you cannot get a replacement), please send them in plain, school-appropriate clothing.
- You can read our Return-to-School Plan and Risk Assessment on the school website.
- We stress that **parents have the right to decide** whether to return their children to school. No action will be taken against those keeping their children at home.

Mrs Pinfold's PE Challenge: Bronze award!






