Listen and appraise	<ul> <li>Know some songs have a chorus or a response/answer part</li> <li>To know that songs have a musical style/genre</li> <li>To learn that songs can describe an idea, feeling or tell a story</li> <li>Describe what the words of a song mean to them</li> <li>Take turns to discuss how a piece of music made you feel.</li> <li>Listen carefully to other people's music.</li> <li>Explore different genres of music and explain personal preferences.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Describe the themes and emotions of musical pieces.</li> <li>Identify where moods can change through a piece of music.</li> <li>Appreciate and comment on other people's music.</li> <li>Identify the musical genre of a piece.</li> <li>Compare different genres of music and respectfully explain personal preferences.</li> <li>Identify is a song has a verse and chorus.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Comment on music with a fluent grasp of different genres and musical vocabulary</li> <li>Respectfully compare and contrast different musical pieces, whilst expressing personal opinion.</li> <li>Explain how music can be influential in both society and to other artists</li> <li>Demonstrate understanding of why certain musical artists are considered particularly influential, and certain pieces have become particularly well-known</li> <li>Appreciate and reflect upon how an artist viewed a situation when creating their music.</li> <li>Explain why song is often used to combat global issues, such as poverty, global warming and racism.</li> </ul>
Musical knowledge	<ul> <li>To know that music has a steady pulse, like a heartbeat.</li> <li>To know that we can create rhythms from words, our names, favourite food, colours and animals.</li> <li>Understand rhythms are different from the steady pulse.</li> <li>Understanding and demonstrate adding high and low sounds (pitch) when we sing and play instruments.</li> <li>Know the names of untuned percussion instruments played in class</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Name instruments heard within a song</li> <li>Explain how pulse, rhythm and pitch are used in a song</li> <li>Understand how a song can build texture</li> <li>Know the names of instruments used in glass e.g. recorder, glockenspiel or xylophone</li> <li>Explain what a crotchet, minim and quaver are.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Explain the following musical terminology and use them with confidence: texture, dynamics, tempo, rhyth, pitch and timbre</li> <li>Identify the structure of a song</li> <li>To explain what a semibreve, minim, crotchet, quaver and semi quaver are.</li> <li>To understand what a clef is and where it can be found on sheet music</li> </ul>



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Performing	<ul> <li>Know several songs off by heart</li> <li>Know that unison is everyone singing at the same time</li> <li>Use their voices in a variety of ways e.g. singing, rapping, sound effects</li> <li>To know why we need to warm up our voices</li> <li>Learn the names of the notes when playing from memory or written down</li> <li>Explore different ways of making music in the world around us using our bodies, instruments and surroundings.</li> <li>Undertand the importance of tidying up any musical equipment when you have finished working</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Explore different ways of layering sounds in the world around us using our bodies, instruments and surroundings in unison.</li> <li>Show understanding of why tidying up after ourselves shows respect for our environment and classmates</li> <li>Sing in unsion in a simple two-part song</li> <li>Demonstrate good singing posture</li> <li>Follow a leader when singing</li> <li>Demonstrate singing in a variety of ways with clarity and confidence</li> <li>Play musical instruments with developing technique</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Take responsibility for tidying and organising resources after work has finished, demonstrating awareness of why this is important to show respect for the environment and others in the class</li> <li>To read simple sheet music</li> <li>Sing in unison, carrying the main tune or backing</li> <li>To demonstrate good singing posture</li> <li>To experience rapping and solo singing</li> <li>Develop an awareness of being 'in tune'</li> <li>Play musical instruments with correct technique</li> <li>Rehearse and perform their part in a unison song</li> </ul>
Improvisation and composition	<ul> <li>Know that improvisation is making up tune on the spot</li> <li>Understanding that improvision is not written down</li> <li>Improvise using two notes</li> <li>Compose a simple piece of music using 2 notes</li> <li>Express a story or mood through music</li> <li>Explain how nature and the physical world can inspire music.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Create original pieces that are influenced by the music of others</li> <li>Improvise using several notes</li> <li>Explore different ways of recording compositions in names, symbols and audio</li> <li>To communicate feelings through a piece of music</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Develop and imaginatively extend musical ideas from different starting points.</li> <li>Explore sources of inspiration from the natural world around us to create soundscapes and music.</li> <li>To communicate with words or sound an idea or concept</li> <li>To record a performance and evaluate it.</li> </ul>
